Control

Much of my life has been trying to find where the actions of my existence fit into the world. God's creation gives so many opportunities, along with hazards and challenges, and in the end, we are all are a similar quest. One of the things which makes me struggle is the presence of control.

Control as defined as a noun in the Oxford Dictionary goes like this; "the power to influence or direct people's behavior or the course of events" or as a verb; "determine the behavior or supervise the running of". Control...I can be in its experience, or I can be within it myself. I can be a participant, or I am the producer of control. If I were to take control, it would mean I am the one directing the course of what comes next. Control also can have meaning in restraint or the opposite- to rule or regulate. Is this what God wants of me...to take control?

When you add descriptions with other types of control it becomes apparent, we have choices. Self-control, in control, out of control all can describe different times in my life. As a child I could bring in my toys, my books and have them near me, wanting to make sure I felt attached to what I loved. The same would hold true for the people in my life. I wanted my mom and dad close; I wanted them near, but then I would rebel for independence and find control in forcing my will. Control can be for good or for not so good. Some Scripture regarding control,

"For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control" 2 Timothy 1:7

"But the fruit of the Spirit is Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control; against such things there is no law" Galatians 5:22-23

I question if God really wants me in control. I've made some unfortunate snares for myself over my years, and I doubt sometimes if I want to be in control. Wouldn't it be better if God just took over?



It is amazing to me some of the new-fangled technologies that have come into our lives over the past decades and one which comes to mind that is challenging me is the self-driving vehicles. I'm not quite ready to give up my hands on the wheel. In my mind I can see where this will fail and then I would be blaming myself for relinquishing my control over a drive down the highway or even scarier yet, a winding road. Or how about an alarm clock? It's plugged into the power outlet, and I've set the wake-up time...but what if a storm comes through and knocks out the power? Can I put faith and trust into something which I can't fully control? I am wondering at the same time how God looks at me. Can God put God's love, faith and trust in me when God can't control me? Does God silently wait for me to let go of my control when God sees I am allowing my own will to be indifferent or even destructive?

Yes, I believe control can be liberating or it can be debilitating. In the great mix of us as the children of God we have lived a history of control issues. This is where we thought we knew best what the other needed to be or do. When we've exerted this kind of control, we were faced with a question...would Love do this? Would love impart controls on how others are to be loved or accepted? If we used our self-control in direct opposition to our human need for being in control of others, could we turn the equation back to God's control? I believe we can. I believe Jesus Christ was the epitome of teaching self-control using empathy to know how our need for controlling others could create echoed strains of oppression, hurting each other. Because God gave us free will which includes control of all types, our wills (and controls) will always in many ways intersect. The real question is are we aware when we are in control, and if so, how is it affecting the world and others?

We hear stories of past control in our families, our societies, even in our churches. I am hoping we learn from how control is an ever-present activity which needs to be...well let's say it...controlled. We need to be open to others' ideas and thoughts just as we would want this dialogue to be open to us...not controlled by the other, but rather kept within control of our selves.

I believe God does have a plan. Not a plan which shapes our every thought and guards all of our steps. It is not a plan made to count our breaths and release our individual lives from any need to exercise control. Rather it is a plan to have us all know God through our own experiences and to make it even more joyful, through the lives of others. Love does have a plan. It started with our ancestors so long ago, and it lives in us today. The most beautiful gift God has given is love itself...and when we have exhausted our own wills, the will of God will be proven and glorified. Let's live for this day letting love take over...and letting Love be in control of our control!

"We humans keep brainstorming options and plans, but GOD's purpose prevails." Proverbs 19:21 (MSG)



Christopher Faulk Blood Drive

At the age of 12, Christopher was diagnosed with end-stage renal failure, and then shortly thereafter a degnerative bone disease, called Interstitial Nephritis. This bone disease had the affected the density of Christopher's bones, requiring several orthopedic surgeries. At 17 years old, Christopher had to have a kidney transplant, and his father being a match, was able to provide Christopher with a kidney. Now twenty-seven years later, Christopher is in need of another kidney. Over the years, and many hospitalizations and many adverse affects to medications, he needed a blood transfusion. This was risky for someone in chronic rejection. Blood, tissue, bone marrow and organ donation were life-saving donations that saved Christopher's life, including his kidney transplant. "Please consider donating blood and getting tissue typed today!"


